Located adjacent to campus at Duke University, the Nasher Museum of Art is an art museum that contains more than 13,000 works ranging from antiquity to contemporary art. <http://thewecf.org/>

Description

A visit to the beautiful campus of Duke University will include a guided tour of the Nasher Museum of Art. “The Museum has celebrated its first decade as a major center for the arts on Duke University’s campus and in the surrounding Research Triangle area. The museum organizes and presents leading-edge exhibitions that travel to institutions worldwide. The 65,000-square-foot Nasher Museum was designed by architect Rafael

Viñoly and built in 2005. The centerpiece of Viñoly’s modernist design is a dramatic 13,000-square-foot glass-and-steel roof rising to a height of 45 feet above the great hall. Five concrete pavilions fan out from a central courtyard to house three large gallery spaces, auditorium, two classrooms, shop and café.” The newest exhibition *Southern Accent: Seeking the American South in Contemporary Art* is outstanding!

The North Carolina Museum of Art began its history in 1924, when the North Carolina State Art Society was formed with a mission to “generate interest in creating an art museum for the state.” Since that time the museum has grown tremendously and relocated several times. In addition to its nationally acclaimed collection, housed in a new addition, the museum also offers outdoor exhibits. “[O]ver a dozen works of art and two miles of trails have made the North Carolina Museum of Art one of a handful of museums in the world

with both a renowned traditional art collection and a large outdoor art park. Its 164 acres make it the largest museum art park in the country.” The featured current Museum exhibit features Old Master British paintings from the 16th – 19th centuries.

A tour of law-related artwork will be led by the Executive Director of the North Carolina Interest on Lawyers Trust Accounts (IOLTA) organization.

Take in the beauty and history of small town North Carolina with a visit to the town of Pittsboro. First, we will visit the pottery of Mark Hewitt, a renowned and award-winning potter. In the early 1970’s, after reading Bernard Leach’s “*A Potter’s Book*,” Mark Hewitt decided to become a studio potter. In 1983 he and his wife, Carol, moved to Pittsboro

NC and set up their pottery. “Mark built a very large wood kiln and began making the distinctive functional pots for which he is known, specializing in very large planters and jars, along with finely made smaller items. He uses local clays and blends the different North Carolinian folk traditions together into a contemporary style that has attracted a sizeable following. Mark’s work has been featured in the *Smithsonian* magazine and on

the cover of *American Craft* magazine, he has written extensively in the ceramic press, and he has exhibited in London, New York and Tokyo, as well as throughout the US. He is well-represented in museum and private collections.”

After your visit, delight in lunch at The Granary Restaurant and shopping at Ferrington Village, a beautiful “thriving Village Center” set on a former dairy farm with boutique shops and restaurants.
