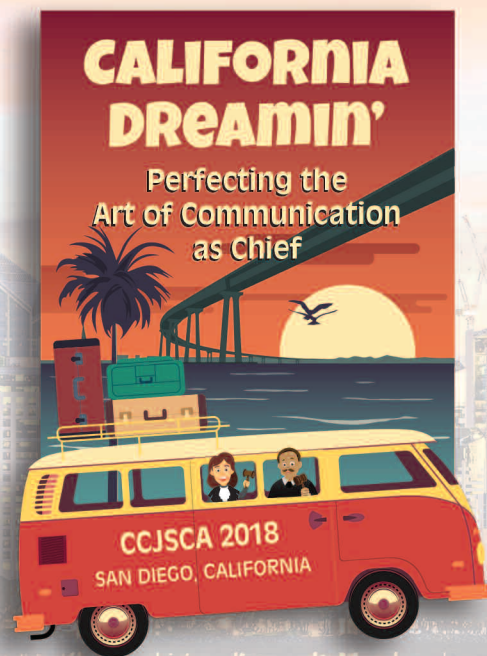

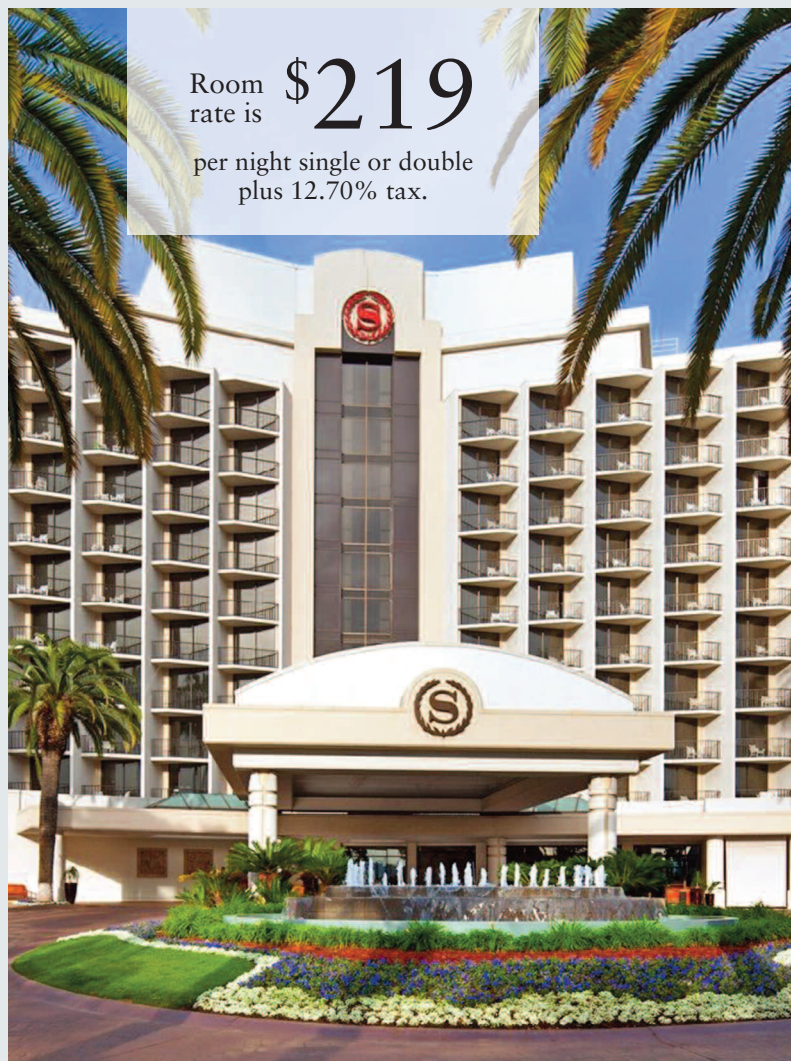

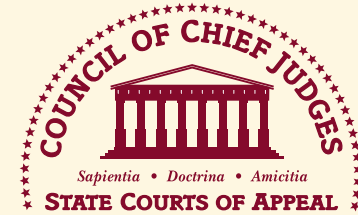

The average maximum temperature in San Diego in November is 70 degrees. The average minimum temperature in November is 54 degrees. You may want to pack an umbrella just in case the area experiences rain showers.
